
# Durga - The Living Mother of All Swami Jyotirupanand

### **ROCKET WOMEN** Chandrayaan-3's 'Nari Shakti'

Chandrayaan has written India's name on the moon forever. India became the first country to reach the south pole of the moon. The commendable efforts of the team of scientists, engineers, and researchers at the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) are to be applauded for this feat. Over 100 women scientists and engineers were involved in the mission, which culminated in India landing its lunar rover on August 23, 2023.



Along with the success of the mission, celebrates Aaratrika the "Rocket Women" who broke the shackles of patriarchy and created a space for themselves history of in the space science. Their dedication and expertise have played a crucial role in the

success of the mission. They carry a beacon of hope and inspiration for the younger generation. According to World Bank data, women make up nearly 43 per cent of total STEM graduates in India, one of the highest in the world. However, women comprise just 14 per cent of scientists, engineers, and technologists at research institutions and universities.

Kalpana Kalahasti, the deputy project director, has been instrumental in overseeing the development of sophisticated imaging devices that have captured highresolution images of Earth's surface.

Reema Ghosh, a robotics specialist, has contributed to the development of the "Pragyan" rover currently operating on the lunar surface.

Ritu Karidhal, a senior scientist and aerospace engineer, has been part of many important space missions, including Chandrayaan-2 and the Mars orbiter mission.

Nidhi Porwal, another senior scientist at ISRO, has worked diligently for four years to ensure the success of Chandrayaan-3. She describes the lander reaching the lunar surface as "magic" and believes that the contribution of women at ISRO sets a strong example for other fields.

The success of India's historic lunar landing is expected to inspire more young women to pursue careers in science and technology. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has recognized the importance of women scientists in the mission by naming the landing site of Chandrayaan-3 on the moon "Shiv Shakti," after the concept of feminine energy in Hindu mythology. It is important to note that the work of female scientists does not end with the Chandrayaan-3 mission. ISRO continues to be home to several other talented female Indian scientists who are dedicated to bringing glory to the nation through their contributions to space exploration.



The Chandrayaan-3 mission is an example of the immense potential and talent that exists among women in the field of science and technology. Their achievements serve as a reminder that gender should never be a barrier to pursuing one's passion and making significant contributions to society.



This gives the audience the space within the play. So, you can be in the play, come out of it, and go back all in the same scene. That is exciting!

Each of the main varieties of mango has an unique taste, flavor and rich in vitamins. The most expensive variety in India is Kohitur and its price can go upto INR 1,500-2,000 per piece. What makes it special is that it is only grown in West Bengal, and was grown only for the royals in the earlier times.

The event was attended by dignitaries, including Mr. Dinesh Pratap Singh — Minister of Horticulture & Agricultural Exports, Uttar Pradesh, India, Mr. Pawan Kapoor — Ambassador of India to the Russian Federation, Mr. A.G. 






India's cinematic heritage and gain insights into the world of filmmaking. The city's vibrant cultural scene and warm hospitality made our stay in Pune truly memorable.

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
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
